Our topic for this half term is 'Moon Zoom'

The children will be asked to choose a task from the menu below each week and to bring this into school by Wednesday of the following week. The children should record evidence of their homework in their homework book.

The children will continue to be given maths homework in their book each week.

MOON ZOOM

These tasks are worth 1 House Point each:

- Ask an adult to help you find out the names of all the people who have walked on the moon. There are 12 of them! Record them in your Homework book.
- Find out the names of 5 constellations (patterns of stars)
- Write a list of questions you would like to ask an astronaut.
- Imagine an alien has crash landed in school grounds. Write a description of the alien and draw a picture of it.

These tasks are worth 2 House Points each:

- With an adult, search the internet for fascinating space facts and make a space fact book.
- Make up your own space poem.
- Visit your local library and find some space-themed books. Read and talk with an adult about the books you find. Can you write down some of the books you found?
- Make up your own space song to teach to the class.
- Design a rocket, labelling its different parts and the materials you could use to make it.
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These tasks are worth 3 House Points each:

- Make a junk telescope from cardboard materials and sticky tape. Use your telescope at bedtime to look up at the stars. Can you draw the pattern of stars that you saw?
- Make a model rocket.
- Imagine you're an astronaut; make a mini book about what it is like. What do you wear? What do you travel in? Where do you travel to? What special missions do you go on?
- Create a model of the solar system (e.g. using balloons, different size balls). Take a photograph and stick it in your homework book. Write about what you did.
